## QUARANTINE IN THE AGE OF THE INTERNET

As I write this, I trust that most of you are at home, isolated from your normal routine, separated from many of the people you care about, who care about you. First – please be safe. Any unnecessary risk poses a health threat to you, and everybody with whom you will come into contact. The more seriously we take the restrictions, the safer everybody will be.

Sitting at home, I am overcome by a feeling of gratitude – for my family, my friends, my community. Each day still begins with מודה אני (*modeh ani*) – I give thanks. For all of the uncertainty, the fear and the concern, I am grateful to be alive, to be in this world, to be here.

I start each day with a prayer for healing, and a prayer for the coming day. I pray that all of the sick should know a complete healing of the body, the mind and the soul. I pray that the coming day will bring news that the worst has passed, that the sick are healing, and that tomorrow will be even brighter.

I start each day with a math lesson – one plus one equals two, when we are counting oranges or widgets. The math that holds us captivated each day is not the math of objects, it is the math of people. If the number who have died “only” increases by one in a given day, that may be good news for public health, but that is not “good news.” Every single individual who gets sick, each and every person who dies, is a complete world – created in the Divine Image and of infinite value. We must maintain our sensitivity that

we are talking about real people and not keeping score in a game. We must be empathic to each person who gets ill or who dies, not in spite of it being painful, but because it is painful – and thereby reminds us that we are alive, that all human life is a gift, and that even in tragedy we affirm our humanity.

I start each day aware that these days and weeks, and perhaps months, will be remembered as an important moment in our lifetime, and an important moment for our society. We will remember how we reacted, what we did and what we did not do. We will remember whether, individually and as a society, we worried about ourselves or each other. We will remember if we acted to protect the most vulnerable, or not.

I start each day witnessing the nobility, the adaptability and the generosity of the people with whom I am blessed to share my life – Jennifer, my children, my mom, all of the beautiful faces and voices I find in all of these ZOOM meetings.

Having now been home for nearly two weeks, my mind wanders to the story of Rabbi Shimon bar Yochai and his son, who hid in a cave for twelve years avoiding persecution from the Romans. Each day a miracle would feed them. They would spend each day studying Torah and praying (Shabbat 33b).

You and I are not being fed by a miraculous carob tree and pool of water in our homes, we are being

### Finding Comfort Amidst a Long, Slow-Motion Disaster

On Friday the 13th of March, I attended a planning meeting at Ohr Shalom for our annual “Lights” event. I haven’t set foot in the synagogue since then. Rather, as someone who suffers from asthma, I have been sheltering at home. I know that many of you also have been staying in your houses – and plan to remain there until the Covid-19 epidemic has been resolved. All of a sudden, an unprecedented disaster has parked itself at our very doorsteps. And, unlike other troubles we might envision, such as an earthquake or a massive fire, it is playing out over a long time, in grand slow motion, so that we cannot figure out how far we are into it, or how long it will last.

The economic effects of the pandemic are staggering, and providing humanitarian relief is hampered by the fact that the *coronavirus* is highly contagious. Nonetheless, as this crisis has developed, decent and creative people have stepped forward to offer comfort. For example, Chef Nancy Silverton at the Mazza restaurants in Los Angeles has turned her Melrose Avenue site into a temporary relief center, distributing daily free meals and basic supplies (diapers, canned foods) to restaurant workers who now find themselves unemployed.

Rosemead-based Panda Express, through its philanthropic arm, has donated \$2 million to the Covid-19 Response Fund of Feeding America, the hunger-relief organization. Cellist Yo Yo Ma is offering music videos, which he calls “Songs of Comfort,” over social media (#songsofcomfort). And several cultural organizations have come up with free online offerings. Go to the Metropolitan Opera website, or try Google Arts & Culture. Right here in San Diego, the Lawrence Family Jewish Community Center has put out a wide range of internet programs, including exercise classes, lecture series, and streaming videos of past J Company shows.

Via the Zoom application, Ohr Shalom has become a synagogue online. I tune in regularly to the daily minyan and the Saturday evening Havdalah service. Each time, I am moved practically to tears as I join a collection of Ohr Shalom members, boxed up on the screen like the celebrities on Hollywood Squares, as we wave to one another and send best wishes.

Now Pesach will arrive the evening of April 8th, and coronavirus or no, our community will welcome it with festive

In all other years Pesach services are held at Ohr Shalom throughout the holiday, this year all services will be held online.

In all other years we end the Seder by praying "Next Year in Jerusalem," this year we will end the Seder the same way and include prayers that everybody should be safe and healthy, and that soon this pandemic will end.







## THE MARCH OF THE LIVING: A LIFE-CHANGING JOURNEY FOR JEWISH TEENS

The March of the Living was scheduled for April 17-May 3, 2020, bringing over 10,000 Jewish 11th- and 12th-grade high school students to Poland and Israel from the United States and 52 countries around the world in order to study the history of the Holocaust and to examine the roots of prejudice, intolerance and hate. *Due to the coronavirus pandemic, this year's March has been cancelled.*

The teens were scheduled to spend their first week in Poland, traveling around the country, visiting remnants of Jewish life, searching for traces of a world that no longer exists. Their visit to Poland would have ended at Auschwitz, where they would have marched along with Holocaust survivors, a key element of the program. And now, with a dwindling number of survivors today, there are not many years more when these survivors will be there. As Eli Wiesel once said: "When you listen to a witness, you become a witness." These teens will need to become the living testimony for the next generations.

The delegation would have flown to Israel to walk in the footsteps of their ancient and modern history. Then, after a little time on the beaches in Tel Aviv, they would join together with all of Israel for a solemn Yom HaZikaron commemoration and a Yom Ha'atzmaut celebration.

The March of the Living program delivers important Jewish and universal messages, such as to instill a love for Israel and a connection to the Jewish people, to never remain silent in the face of oppression and to never stand by when there are threats of anti-Semitism. Furthermore, they would have participated in discussions about *tikkun olam*, teaching to provide assistance to those most in need and to reach out to people of other faiths and cultures.

Eight San Diego teens were scheduled to be a part of March of the Living this year. Two of the eight are from Ohr Shalom: **Shayna Meltzer** and **Mikhail Lemoine**, accompanied by Jessica Lemoine as an excited chaperone. We share their disappointment that they will not be able to go.

Last month, as a community, we mourned the death of our beloved **Vanina Bunton**, daughter of **Liliane** and **Roger (Z'L) Zouari**, mother of **Jeremiah**, **Noah**, **Shoshannah** and **Nechama**.

Vanina sustained the Ohr Shalom community in so many ways – through teaching in our Religious School and our B'nai Mitzvah students, through leading services and chanting Torah, and through all of her work cooking in and managing the Ohr Shalom kitchen.

Her spirit and presence will forever be felt for a blessing in our community. May her family and all who love her be comforted amongst all the mourners of  
Zion and Jerusalem.

If you call when you arrive, they will come outside to pick up what you bring so you won't have to look for parking.
