MOVING FORWARD IN UNCERTAIN TIMES

And the earth was unformed and void. God said: let there be light, and there was light. Out of the chaos, came order. Night dawned on a new day, which led to a week, and more.

Then, of course, we left the Garden, but we left the Garden with our heads held high. The man looked at the woman and said, I will call you *em kol chai* – the mother of all living.

Try to imagine the anxiety that the two of them must have experienced as they went from the known to the unknown, from the safety of the Garden to the danger of life outside of the Garden. They didn't know what the world would be like when they woke up in this new world.

Life outside of the garden was certainly different from life in the Garden, but there was also continuity – they still had each other. Soon, they became parents and the life after the Garden had blessings, joy and challenges, that weren't part of their life in Paradise.

You and I didn't arrive at this moment of Stay-at-Home, and now "Reopening," from the safety and security of Eden, but for many of us, these past few months have brought us to questioning many of our former habits and worrying about what tomorrow will be like as we move forward.

The uncertainty, that is not knowing what will be, is very real, and brings with it anxiety. Different people experience this anxiety differently – some worry, some obsess, some can't sleep, and some are truly paralyzed.

First, be aware of your anxiety level, and make sure you do what you need to do to take care of yourself. Reach out to your family and friends. Be open to seeking additional help if you find that you are overwhelmed. If you would like to talk about this, please know that I am available – just call.

As humans and as Jews, we have moved through many periods of great uncertainty. Like the man and the woman leaving the Garden, we have not gone through these moments alone. We have always gone through them strengthened by our ties to Jewish community, our embracing of our tradition, and our connection to the possibility of holiness in our lives.

I think of our current moment of uncertainty as an "Exit the Garden Moment," and we are together as a community – family and friends. Please embrace them. Together as a community, the world is a whole lot less scary, and we are better able to look at the uncertainty of this moment and look forward to the beautiful blessings that we share, and will once again be able to share together in person.

For now, in a world of uncertainty, take a deep breath, and embrace all of the good that we share, and the opportunities we have to continue to live, learn, help others, pray and connect.

For now, be safe and be healthy, and also – *chazak ve'ametz* – be strong and be brave. I look forward to seeing you online and when safe, in person at Third and Laurel.

Ohr Shalom Amidst the Tempest

This column addresses questions that are sure to be on the minds of everyone at Ohr Shalom. *When will everything return to normal? What will the High Holy Days look like? How is the synagogue being impacted financially?* Here are the best answers we have at present.

The coming summer at Ohr Shalom will be a high-tech one, with ongoing Zoom-based programming. If you have yet to attend a prayer service or class via Zoom, please do so! If you have access to email, texting or a telephone, then you can participate in an Ohr Shalom Zoom experience. Look in your email to find an “Ohr Shalom Daily Update,” which announces activities and provides Zoom and phone links.

The big questions: When will we resume operations within the building? Where will we be for the High Holy Days? Erev Rosh Hashanah will be Friday, September 18th – three months from now.

The job of recommending when and how to resume on-site operations at Ohr Shalom has been delegated to a new committee: the Reopening Task Force. That group includes health professionals, attorneys, a workplace safety and sanitation consultant, and members of our administration and Board – all generously devoting their time to achieving a safe reopening. While the Task Force is watching closely the ongoing COVID-19 situation in San Diego, it also is investigating the complicated logistics of operating a public entity amidst a viral pandemic. The group monitors directives that continuously are emerging from the CDC, our local Health Department, the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism, and others.

We all deeply miss greeting one another with warm hugs in our own familiar sanctuary. However, our plans for reopening must be guided by our Jewish values: We are responsible for one another, and nothing is more important than safeguarding a life. The questions of when and how to resume operations at Ohr Shalom truly are sobering in their moral import – we are looking for strategies to prevent our beloved fellow congregants from contracting an illness that has killed more than 100,000 Americans. Ohr Shalom will reopen when the Task Force recommends reopening, and the Board and staff agree to do so.

Thanks to years of good fundraising, sound fiscal management, and successful *Lights of Ohr Shalom* events, our synagogue has financial reserves. Were I able to touch you, I would pat each Ohr Shalom member on the back in gratitude for your ongoing generosity and support. As a small business, we have received a “PPP” loan from the U.S. government to cover salaries for two months. Since we will not receive the revenue anticipated from the cancelled *Lights* event this year, the government loan will enable us to end the 2019-20 fiscal year on June 30th in the black while retaining our staff at full salary.

We intend to operate the synagogue for the next fiscal year in a manner that does not disturb our savings. To ensure that we accomplish that, we have formed a Finance Group, comprised of senior Board members, which will keep regular watch over financial matters for the next year and beyond. That group already is hard at work on next year’s budget, preparing a no-frills operating plan, looking for savings where possible, anticipating expenses, and developing fundraising projects.

Please recall that our annual fundraiser, *Lights of Ohr Shalom*, which had been planned for this past May 3rd, was intended to honor 14 of our “Sages,” our most senior members. However, the COVID-19 pandemic robbed us of the opportunity to celebrate them in person. Now we plan to dedicate Ohr Shalom’s annual 2020-2021 calendar to them. Each honoree will be the subject of a page facing a month, and we will add a month or two. The calendar will be accompanied by pages of ads and greetings, similar to those of our past *Tribute Journals*, which can be dedicated to a particular Sage, or to all of them. Already under development, the stellar keepsake calendar “In Celebration of our Sages,” will be printed and sent to all Ohr Shalom members in time for the High Holy Days. Elsewhere in this issue you will find information on opportunities to purchase ads that tell your favorite seniors how much you appreciate them.

While the COVID-19 pandemic has been transforming the world, our synagogue community, ingeniously and with solidarity, has managed to prevail. Thanks to Zoom, we have not missed a beat in providing “essential





Annual Ohr Shalom Calendar with Tribute Pages Coming This Summer!
